Our nation is in the midst of four crises—a health pandemic, an economic crisis, a reckoning with racism and a climate emergency—all made worse by President Trump.

And now Trump is putting the existence of our democracy on the line—a fifth crisis—by threatening to uproot the peaceful transfer of power if he loses the election in November. Trump sees the presidency as his to own, not as a position elected by “we the people.”

Donald Trump creates chaos and division at every turn, in order to hold on to his power, at the expense of the American people—failing to tackle COVID-19; demanding schools reopen without the necessary resources; eliminating healthcare, including protections for people with pre-existing conditions; fanning the flames of hate; and helping the rich get richer while attacking unions and failing to help working people get through this economic crisis.
